PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

Council News: Two applicants applied for the Council vacancy, and after interviews, Cllr Ian Hancock of Smalldale was co-opted as a new councillor. We congratulate Ian on his appointment and thank both candidates for coming forward. In order to obtain best value Council has entered into a three year agreement for council insurance on favourable terms. This agreement now runs until September 2015. Council is taking steps to acquire a new capability offered by the Localism Bill 2011 in order to better manage the village on behalf of residents.

Playing Fields: The Playing Fields committee would like to install more benches/picnic tables around the bottom perimeter of Town Bottom Playing Field and wonder if any residents would be interested in sponsoring them. The tree surgeon has carried out work on a number of parish council trees, mainly on Beggars Plot, in order to keep them safe for residents and further work may be required to reduce the height of certain trees. The annual RoSPA inspection of the Playing Fields is now due and we await the inspectors report.

Allotments: There has been a problem with the financial arrangements relating to the field previously identified and so it will not now be possible to use this field. This is a disappointment to the Allotments Group which is now continuing its search for suitable land.

Caretaking: In addition to the routine monthly jobs, our caretakers have been working hard repairing and maintaining council property around the village. Besides repairs to walls and fences the many council benches around the village have been repaired and treated.

"The Cordwainer & Peak Orthotics", a specialist shoe making company, have opened a business in Brough, following demand for an improved supply of 'orthotic' insoles by customers in Derbyshire. Proprietor Philip Taylor moved the business here from Lancashire, where he and his team have been making orthopaedic shoes for hundreds of clients since the business opened in 1996. Phil explained the move to Derbyshire as 'My family were from Eyam originally and although I was born in Aldershot after my father left to join the army, I always considered the area as home. Ironically The Cordwainer & Peak Orthotics is the first shoemaking business in the area for over one hundred years. At the beginning of the 1900's the Hope Valley boasted over a dozen factories making thousands of pairs of heavy boots and slippers every week, the subject of a forthcoming talk by Philip at Buxton Museum on October 26th. The new Orthotics service went live in May this year and already there has been interest from both private clients and podiatrists looking for an improved service for their clients. Jane Sampson died on 3rd April, aged 55 years, in a Johannesburg Hotel after being taken ill on a flight from England. Born in Bradwell, the only daughter of Matthew (Matty) and Margaret Urwin, she was educated at the two Bradwell schools and Hope Valley College. Jane went on to Chesterfield Technical College and then to Lady Mabel College at Wentworth. She married John Sampson of Grindleford and

they lived in Maidstone, where Jane worked as a teacher. They then returned to Derbyshire, living at Litton Mill, and Jane worked in the wages department of Blue Circle before taking up an appointment at Tipton School in Sheffield. She and John then moved to South Africa where they spent the next 20 years, Jane teaching swimming and English business studies. They then moved to Ghana for five years before moving to Swindon. Latterly Jane worked as camp manager at a mineral mine in the Democratic Republic of Congo, to where she was returning when taken ill. She enjoyed sport, walking, cycling, swimming, gardening and quilting. She leaves her husband John, sons Andrew, Edward and David, daughter in law Becky, mother Margaret and brother Clive. The funeral was at St Barnabas Church, followed by cremation at Hutcliffe Wood on 1st May.

MRS EUGENIE KAY CUDWORTH

Eugenie Cudworth died on 24th April at Burton Close Nursing Home aged 96 years. Born in Sheffield, the eldest daughter of Charles and Eugenie Hawley, she lived in London and Sheffield before moving to Torr Top, Bradwell in 1928. She was educated at Sheffield and at Bradwell Church School. She worked at the family smallholding at Torr Top, also at Bamford and Edale Mills and later at Cressbrook Mill. She first married

Tom Brightmore and then George Cudworth. After marriage she lived in Tideswell, Deepcar, Bamford and Caroline Court, Hope before moving into the nursing home. Eugenie was a dog lover, enjoyed walking and music and was a member of the Peak Singers choir. She leaves a daughter Barbara, son in law John, grandchildren John and Sharon, and great grandchildren Lauren, Casey and Nathan. Both husbands and her sister Barbara pre-deceased her. The funeral, followed by burial was at St Barnabas Church on 4th May.

MRS MARGARET RITA CHARLES

Rita Charles died at home on 6th May aged 73 years. Born in Sheffield the only child of Stanley and Pattie Hall, she went to school in Tideswell after the family moved there. She started work at Thornhill's egg packing plant in Great Longstone, later working in the Blue Circle canteen and then the canteen at Bradwell Junior School. Rita married Gerald Charles of Bradwell and they lived in Tideswell before moving to Bradwell where she remained until moving to Nicholson Court in Tideswell. She enjoyed cruising holidays, knitting, baking and reading. She leaves a son Andrew, daughters Catherine and Julie and seven grandchildren. Cremation was at Hutcliffe Wood followed by a service of thanksgiving at Tideswell Methodist Church on 16th May.
