INFANTS SCHOOL



In June PCSO Anthony Boswell visited pupils at Bradwell Infants School to give a talk about staying safe on the roads and when out and about. He highlighted road safety and the importance of being seen in order to stay safe, and gave advice on safe places to cross the road. 'Stop, Look and Listen', wear high visibility clothing, do not run across the road and use bikes, scooters or skateboards safely.

THINK BEFORE YOU PARK!!

To add a little to the above about considerate parking. One particular area of concern is in the space immediately outside the church gates, by the lane leading to the infant's school. Cars parked here regularly block the pavement completely, forcing pedestrians to walk in the road to get past. This is an **extremely** dangerous practice, as large vehicles pass through there and they might not see a pedestrian. It is illegal to park there anyway, but if you do - please don't block the footpath!

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Brook Cleaning: The weed clearing work was carried out over the weekend of 8th/9th July by two Community Payback teams, with disposal of the rubbish and weed being organised by Bradda Dads. This work has greatly improved the Brook as a village amenity for both residents and visitors alike and will allow Bradda Dads to run the 'World Famous Duck Race' again during this year's Carnival week.

Playing Fields and Open Spaces committee: A number of different projects are being considered around the village. Some initial work has already been started in the Rose Garden and the work at the Peace Garden (to widen the entrance to allow wheelchair access, improve the entrance surfacing & install a new gate) has been completed. Further work is planned to improve the basketball court at Town Bottom. The zip wire mechanism at Town Bottom playing field has now been refurbished and is proving to be ever popular.

Toilet Block at Town Bottom: Following the meeting held with a DDDC official to explore the options for our toilet block, some initial answers to our questions have been received. However, Council still needs answers to some key questions before we can decide how to proceed.

Car Parking committee: The committee has met with a DCC Highways officer to review the feasibility of upgrading a number of locations around the village to provide additional parking. In some cases, the suggestions are to 'harden' selected verges by levelling them and then installing Grasscrete surfacing. The DCC response to these suggestions is now awaited.

Youth Activities: The programme of events organised by Councillor Sowerby and delivered by the YHA Edale Activity Centre has continued over recent months. Recent activities included 'weaselling' on local rocky edges and a canoeing outing. This programme of activities has been enthusiastically received by those taking part. Now that the agreed programme is nearing the end, the committee will meet in the near future to decide how to proceed.

S137 Grants: Council has topped up the fund of money available to award as grants to village groups / organisations and would now be happy to consider applications for financial assistance. If your group would like to apply for some of the council's S137 Grant money, please contact the Parish Clerk.

Public Participation: Residents continue to attend council meetings to raise matters of concern directly with the council. A recent request was to ask council to consider installing a skate / scooter park somewhere in the parish. This request will be put on the next agenda for consideration.

The council welcomes members of the public to attend both the main council and its committee meetings. Council meetings are generally held at 7:30 p.m. on the first Tuesday of most months in the Methodist Lounge on Towngate. See the parish notice boards. Contacts:
