PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

PC Youth Centre

The Centre has started well, with around forty young people attending regularly and thirty five volunteers registered as helpers. Bringing the electrics up to standard cost almost £1000 and we have ordered more play equipment to cater for members' requests. The older children have decided to raise money for materials so they can decorate the part of the building which they have established as their own domain. The boys are seeking sponsors (outside the Coop) for a supervised walk on October 27th and the girls are planning a supervised session of sponsored bag-filling at Morrison's, Buxton, on October 26th. Your financial support for their initiatives would be greatly appreciated.

Dale End

At our September meeting we decided to seek 'Adverse Possession' of a piece of land at Dale End. We are concerned at the overgrown state of this plot which, we understood, belonged to Highways. However, when we asked DCC Highways to take action they denied ownership. The Parish Clerk will now advise neighbours that we intend to claim this land and will arrange to fence-off the area. Unless someone can prove otherwise, the PC will assume ownership and carry out a programme of improvement to the southern entrance to the village. After twelve years of undisputed 'Adverse Possession' the PC could then apply to the Land Registry for the land to be registered as PC property.

Sheffield bus diversion

I've been asked if it might be possible for the 12.10 pm, or the 1.10 pm, 272 Sheffield buses to be diverted via Hallamshire Hospital. This would make it easier for people to visit patients and then catch the 3.52 pm back from the hospital direct to Bradwell. If you feel this diversion would be useful, please contact me or the Parish Clerk. If there is sufficient interest we could confer with the other Hope Valley PCs and then approach the providers of this bus service.

Lafarge

At the September PC/Lafarge liaison meeting, we were informed that the initial survey for the proposed new road from the works to Bradwell has been completed and has recommended that it be two-way. The cost is estimated at around one million pounds. Bradwell PC is currently opposed to the scheme but Hope, and presumably Brough/Shatton PCs would support it. It would of course have to be submitted for approval to Peak Park and DCC Highways, and Lafarge say that they do not propose to start the process before 2009. The new office block will be officially opened in November and the new rail complex is expected to be operational by the end of February. Following the successful trial of meat and

bonemeal-burning in one kiln, a trial is now planned for the other – starting in October. Chris Furness

INFLUENZA VACCINATIONS

Are You Eligible?

Only if you are a Category 1 patient and fall into the following categories can you now make an appointment to have a flu vaccination.

A patient who is over 65 year old or suffers with any of the following chronic conditions is classified as a Category 1 patient by the Department of Health

Chronic Heart Disease

Chronic Respiratory Disease

Chronic Renal Disease

Chronic Liver Disease

Diabetes

Immunosuppression

Please contact Tideswell Surgery on 01298 871292 to make an appointment or to check if you are eligible to have the vaccine. Please do not ask for an appointment for the flu vaccine unless you fall into one of the categories listed above. The Department of Health specify the practice cannot give vaccines to patients who are not deemed to be at risk. We request that you do not put the reception staff under any pressure to make an inappropriate appointment.

MR WILLIAM YEARDLEY

William (Bill) Yeardley died on 2nd September in Calow Hospital aged 87 years. Born in Sheffield, one of the five children of William and Annie Yeardley, he went to school in Sheffield and then Hope, when the family moved there when he was 12 years old. He spent all his working life at the cement works, except for a period during the war when he served in the Sherwood Foresters, was captured at Dunkirk in 1940 and spent the remainder of the war as a prisoner. He married Freda Bradwell and spent the rest of his life in Bradwell. He was a home loving family man and enjoyed walking and gardening. Bill leaves his wife Freda, daughters Susan and Jeanne, sons-in-law Ian and Peter, five grandchildren, five great-grandchildren, his sister Brenda and brother Lawrence. His sister Doris and brother Jim pre-deceased him. The funeral service took place at St Barnabas Church on 13th September, followed by burial.
